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LETTER FROM CHAIRMAN STEVEN HORSFORD

It has been the honor of a lifetime to serve as chair of the Congressional Black Caucus during this pivotal time in our nation's history. QUARTER FOUR MEMBER HIGHLIGHTS

- Rep. Barbara Lee attended the signing in the U.S. Capitol of her bipartisan legislation to honor the life and work of the late Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm, the first Black woman elected to Congress. Vice President Kamala Harris signed the Shirley Chisholm Congressional Gold Medal Act, posthumously awarding Chisholm with a Congressional Gold Medal the highest award Congress can bestow in commemoration of her accomplishments, activism, and legacy.
- Rep. James E. Clyburn, Rep. Ayanna Pressley, and Rep. Mary Gay Scanlon led 60 of their colleagues in sending a letter to President Biden urging him to use his executive clemency power in the final months of his presidency to reunite families, address longstanding injustices in our legal system, and set our nation on the path toward ending mass incarceration.
- Assistant Leader Joe Neguse hosted USDA Deputy Secretary Xochitl Torres Small at a local farm in his district to discuss local regenerative agriculture efforts and our work to support small farmers and ranchers through programs like the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP), which provides technical and financial assistance to agricultural producers and forest landowners to address natural resource concerns.
- Rep. Lucy McBath was recognized for having the best congressional office for constituent services by the Congressional Management Foundation.
- Rep. Troy A. Carter, Sr. slept outside at the Covenant
 House to shine a light on youth homelessness in the
 United States. Covenant House New Orleans is a
 youth homeless shelter that has touched the lives
 of over 35,000 youth since opening. With collective
 action, from government, communities, and
 compassionate individuals, we can end this epidemic.
- Sen. Reverend Raphael Warnock and Sen. Jon
 Ossoff's federal judge recommendee, Tiffany Rene
 Johnson, was confirmed to the United States District
 Court for the Northern District of Georgia.
- Rep. Gwen Moore celebrated funding for the Sister MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary Community Project.

- Rep. Steven Horsford voted for the FY25 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) to deliver major wins for Nevada and historic investments in military pay and defense infrastructure he secured through his work in the Armed Services Committee. The FY25 NDAA includes wins secured by Congressman Horsford, including \$25 million for the Nevada National Security Site's PULSE project, \$18 million for military construction at the Hawthorne Army Depot, and measures to evaluate quality-of-life improvements at Creech and Nellis Air Force Bases.
- Rep. Frederica Wilson, alongside Los Angeles
 Mayor and former CBC Chair Karen Bass and
 Superintendent Alberto Carvalho, launched the 5000
 Role Models of Excellence Project in the Los Angeles
 Unified School District. This mentorship program,
 which Rep. Wilson founded over 30 years ago,
 aims to break the school-to-prison pipeline.
 Rep. Maxine Waters and Rep. Sydney Kamlager Dove also gave virtual remarks.
- Rep. Dwight Evans hosted a telephone town hall on Medicare open enrollment in November with six expert guest speakers, which drew more than 14,000 listeners from Pennsylvania's 3rd Congressional District.
- Rep. Sydney Kamlager-Dove presented a \$500,000 check to Brotherhood Crusade for its Trauma-Informed Anti-Recidivism Initiative to ensure that system-impacted youth not only get back on their feet but reach their full potential.
- Rep. Shontel Brown hosted a Housing Expo at
 Cleveland State University. The expo featured the U.S.
 Department of Housing and Urban Development,
 financial institutions, and state and local agencies.
 Congresswoman Brown organized the event to help
 connect prospective first-time homebuyers with
 resources and information. The expo included a panel
 discussion on how to boost homeownership and make
 housing more affordable.
- Rep. Bonnie Watson Coleman introduced the Commission on Advancing Restorative Justice in Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 2024. The bill would authorize the Secretary of Education to establish an interagency commission, in close collaboration with the Department of Health and Human Services, to promote restorative justice practices in elementary and secondary education.

- Rep. Gabe Amo conducted a Blue Economy tour of his district. Congressman Amo meet with nonprofit leaders who are training workers for careers in offshore wind, researchers who are deepening our understanding of the ocean, and cutting-edge manufacturing companies who are creating jobs and investing in Rhode Island. To cap off this multistop, multi-day tour, Congressman Amo introduced the Blue Economy and Innovation Act, a bill that would leverage funding from the National Science Foundation to scale ocean research and support regional tech hubs.
- Rep. Lauren Underwood introduced the Health
 Coverage for Inclusive and Valued Families Act of
 2024, legislation that would amend the Affordable
 Care Act to include fertility treatment and care as an
 essential health benefit, greatly expanding access to
 fertility services, including in vitro fertilization (IVF),
 and making this essential care more affordable and
 accessible for families.
- Rep. Emanuel Cleaver's Hello Girls Congressional Gold Medal Act was passed by the House of Representatives. The bipartisan bill would award the Congressional Gold Medal, the highest civilian honor bestowed by Congress, to more than 220 American women who served as essential telephone operators with the U.S. Army Signal Corps during World War I. Known as the Hello Girls, the women were the first female soldiers to be officially deployed to a combat zone in American history.
- Rep. Glenn Ivey held a tele-town hall to help federal workers understand their rights as civil servants. The experts assembled were able to share insights as to the impact of Schedule F and what to expect in 2025.
- Rep. Joyce Beatty was inducted into the Ohio Civil Rights Commission's 15th Civil Rights Hall of Fame. This prestigious honor, shared with ten fellow inductees, recognizes Ohioans who have made significant contributions to advancing civil rights, cultural awareness, and equity. Congresswoman Beatty's decades-long advocacy in fostering a more just and inclusive society, including her leadership as Chair of the Congressional Black Caucus during our nation's racial reckoning, was celebrated as part of this recognition.

- Rep. Hank Johnson hosted the Sixth Annual Unsung
 Heroes Awards Program to recognize 15 exceptional
 individuals from Georgia's Fourth Congressional
 District for their selfless contributions to the
 community. The event, held at Legacy Park in Decatur,
 celebrated the dedication and impact of these
 individuals across DeKalb, Rockdale, and Newton
 counties.
- Rep. Yvette D. Clarke's Cybersecurity Internship Program Act passed the House with bipartisan support. This bill grants the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) authority to provide paid cybersecurity internships to students attending secondary and technical schools, and undergraduate and postgraduate institutions. This legislation also requires DHS to provide an annual report to Congress regarding the number of participating individuals, job duties, supporting agencies, outreach, and recruiting efforts implemented by the DHS program.
- Rep. Yvette D. Clarke was elected Chairwoman of the Congressional Black Caucus (CBC). She will serve as the 29th Chair of the CBC and be sworn in when the new 119th session of Congress begins in January.
- Rep. Al Green honored Mother Lessie Benningfield Randle, one of only two survivors of the 1921 Tulsa Race Massacre, on her 110th birthday and encouraged his colleagues to support upcoming legislation to provide compensation to the survivors.
- Rep. Don Davis delivered pies to first responders and 911 telecommunicators working over Thanksgiving and extended Thanksgiving greetings across all 19 counties in North Carolina's First Congressional District during his second annual "Pies of Thanks" Thanksgiving Tour. Congressman Davis personally delivered pies as tokens of appreciation, symbolizing the community's gratitude towards these essential personnel.
- Rep. Alma S. Adams, Ph.D. visited the Charlotte Bilingual Pre-school on October 31st. As quality childcare has become harder to find and increasingly expensive in North Carolina, Charlotte Bilingual Preschool helps to ensure that Spanish-speaking families in the Charlotte area have an accessible resource that prepares their kids for kindergarten, and then for life. The younger a child begins learning a new language, the more they will learn.

- Rep. Jasmine Crockett, Sen. Cory Booker, Sen.
 Reverend Raphael Warnock, and 18 members of the
 House Democratic Caucus sent a letter to President
 Joseph R. Biden calling for him to use his clemency
 power to commute those individuals serving longer
 sentences due to the crack cocaine versus powder
 cocaine sentencing disparity that was established
 during the 1980s War on Drugs.
- Rep. Sanford D. Bishop, Jr., in coordination with Senator Jon Ossoff, Sen. Reverend Raphael Warnock, Congressman Austin Scott, and Georgia state leaders, helped lead bipartisan, bicameral efforts to direct the Biden-Harris Administration disaster relief in response to Hurricane Helene. In addition to keeping in frequent contact with federal, state, and local officials as well as families and businesses in the area, he joined President Biden as they toured hurricane affected areas and discussed how federal departments and agencies can help Georgians recover.
- Rep. Jennifer McClellan joined the ERA Caucus and other leaders to call on President Biden to publish the Equal Rights Amendment as the 28th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.
- Rep. Stacey Plaskett, Ranking Member of the National Intelligence Enterprise Subcommittee, spoke at the Parliamentary Intelligence Security Forum on the increasingly fragile global order and the importance of cooperation between the United States and our allies to strengthen national and global security.
- Rep. LaMonica McIver introduced her first bill, the Better Ballistic Body Armor Act, to increase the availability of protective body armor, like bulletproof vests, that better fits the bodies of women agents in the Department of Homeland Security, including those with TSA, FEMA, Secret Service and others. This bipartisan, bicameral bill would help eliminate the potentially lethal consequences of ill-fitting body armor for women and people with varying body types and would improve job safety for many NJ-10 residents and workers nationwide.

- Rep. Valerie Foushee was presented with the first annual "Valerie Foushee Community Service Award" by the Durham Branch NAACP to celebrate her tireless work in improving her local community and ensuring that every person has the opportunity to live a safe and fulfilling life.
- Rep. Erica Lee Carter and Congressman Michael McCaul (R-Texas) reintroduced the Sheila Jackson Lee Stop Human Trafficking in School Zones Act (H.R. 10228) to increase penalties for human trafficking offenses involving children. Specifically, this bill establishes an additional five years of prison time for certain human trafficking offenses that occur in a school zone or within 1,000 feet of school-sponsored activity. The reintroduced legislation was named after the late Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee, who co-wrote the original bill, in honor of her work and dedication to end human trafficking.
- Rep. Gregory W. Meeks introduced bipartisan
 legislation with Rep. Gwen Moore and Rep. Lloyd
 Smucker titled the "Survivor Justice Tax Prevention
 Act." This legislation will amend the nation's tax code
 to ensure survivors of sexual abuse and unwanted
 and illegal sexual contact do not have to pay taxes on
 settlement income when they prevail legally against
 their abuser.
- Rep. Sheila Cherfilus-McCormick's bill, the Access to AEDs Act, passed the House and the Senate in the HEARTS Act, giving schools access to life-saving AED equipment and CPR training.
- Rep. Cori Bush and Rep. Ayanna Pressley led 120 of their colleagues in a letter to President Biden urging him to direct the Archivist to certify and publish the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) as the 28th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution before the end of his presidency. She also hosted a press conference in early December urging him to act.


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
