





MESSAGE FROM CHAIRMAN HORSFORD



We won't be silenced and we aren't going back.

The members of the CBC continue to defend our democracy from the attacks on public education, ensure diverse representation in the federal judiciary and protect voting rights for all – the right from which all other rights are achieved.

The last few months have presented new challenges and opportunities to address. From the recent decisions by the U.S. Supreme Court to strike down race-conscious preferences in the admissions process in higher education, to a startling case that allows discrimination – for the first time ever – to be upheld based on someone's beliefs regarding sexual orientation, to the courts overreach against the executive branch to provide relief to families and students facing the mounting burden of student debt.

The Court upheld Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act in *Allen v. Milligan*, which will provide for full representation of Black voters in Alabama, Louisiana, potentially Georgia, and other states. The Court also struck down the independent state theory advanced by conservative state legislators in North Carolina which would give state legislatures unchecked power to overturn federal elections. Despite these important wins, the work ahead on defending democracy, advancing race, equity and inclusion continue to be among the most critical issues of our time.

This past quarter, CBC members promoted issues of women's equality in the fight to pass the Equal Rights Amendment, promoted the importance of fatherhood through the Commission on the Social Status of Black

Men and Boys, advanced important priorities for Black service members and families and secured historic funding for HBCUs in the national defense budget advanced in the House.

Building bridges to the African diaspora, CBC members hosted and participated in a number of important convenings with the Canadian Black Parliamentary Caucus in Washington, DC, and House Democratic Leader Hakeem Jeffries led a delegation of members to the 50th anniversary of CariCom in Trinidad and Tobago to promote the important relationships between the U.S. and Caribbean nations.

In partnership with the CBC Institute, members have participated in Democracy for the People Summer of Action town halls and forums in Charleston, South Carolina; Columbus, Ohio; Chicago, Illinois; New Orleans, Louisiana; and Las Vegas, Nevada to date with more cities to come prior to the 60th Anniversary of the March on Washington in August.

Democracy for the People has provided Members opportunities to listen directly to the people in the communities we serve and to provide rapid response information on the various Supreme Court decisions and local/state actions impacting democracy and race.

We will continue to advance the mission of the CBC and deliver historic wins for the American people, particularly for Black America, by building on our historic job creation, securing capital for entrepreneurs and small businesses, investing in our communities around broadband and infrastructure and working to address environmental injustice in the communities our Members represent.

02 ON THE ISSUES



DEMOCRACY

In anticipation of **voting rights and redistricting decisions** in *Allen v. Milligan*, *Moore v. Harper*, and *Students for Fair Admissions v. UNC and Harvard* the CBC convened a historic and first-of-its-kind **National Summit on Democracy and Race** engaging scholars, activists, and policy experts to develop legislative, executive, and community-based solutions to fortify our democracy. Following the Summit, the Congressional Black Caucus

Institute **launched Democracy for the People** to hold messaging and mobilization events on democracy and race in America in cities across the country.

Read together — democracy won at the Supreme Court. The CBC will continue to push for the passage of the **John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act** to restore the **Voting Rights Act**, address nationwide voter suppression tactics targeting Black communities, and ensure the promise of one person, one vote.

DEBT LIMIT/ SNAP

The CBC stood strong against **MAGA Republicans' proposed cuts** and heightened work requirements for **SNAP** during the debt ceiling negotiations with strong leadership from Rep. Jahana Hayes and Rep. David Scott.

During negotiations surrounding the debt ceiling, the CBC drew nationwide attention to the detrimental effects the Republicans' plan would have on the communities we serve.

Recognizing the critical importance of SNAP in reducing hunger, the CBC worked with the Biden-Harris Administration to ensure that millions of hard-working Americans could maintain access to food, while expanding benefits to homeless individuals, veterans, and youth who aged out of foster care through age 24.



PUBLIC SAFETY

In the year since President Biden issued the executive order to advance accountable policing, the CBC has held the Administration accountable for full and effective implementation of all provisions in the order.

The CBC met with Attorney General Merrick Garland, Associate Attorney General Vanita Gupta, and Assistant Attorney General Kristen Clarke to discuss the Department's progress in instituting use of force **policies that focus on prioritizing human life, ending chokeholds and no-knock warrants, eliminating the transfer of military weapons to local police departments**, providing guidance to states and localities on conducting internal misconduct investigations, and prioritizing awarding grants to local agencies that voluntarily adopt the provisions in the executive order.

Due in part to the CBC's advocacy, the Department has satisfied many of the provisions in the order, reflecting an important step toward keeping all communities safe. The CBC is continuing to advocate for meaningful **bipartisan public safety legislation** to create safer communities and hold



police officers who violate the public trust accountable.

BLUE SLIP

The CBC engaged with both the White House and Senator Dick Durbin to solidify meaningful participation and consultation with Members who have judicial vacancies in their districts or states to ensure that **diverse nominees — particularly civil rights lawyers — are swiftly advanced through the Senate Judiciary Committee** to receive a vote on the Senate floor.

As a result of our advocacy, **Judge Nancy Abudu was confirmed to be the first Black woman on the 11th Circuit Court of Appeals**,



covering Florida, Alabama, and Georgia on May 18, 2023, and **Judge Natasha Merle was confirmed to the Eastern District of New York** on June 21, 2023 after waiting over a year for vote. The CBC will continue to engage substantively in the nominations process and will advance nominees that will uphold our values.


